- All students with declared social work major are automatically admitted as Pre-Social Work students.
- In order to be admitted fully as a business major at Wright State, students will need to achieve a cumulative GPA of a 2.25.
- Students must earn a C or higher in ENG 1111, ENG 1112, SWK 1100, and SWK 2230 at Clark State.
- Students must complete the following coursework at Clark State prior to being fully admitted to the Social Work program: BIO 1410, COM 1110, ECO 1100, ENG 1111, ENG 1112, PLS 1100, PSY 1111, SOC 1110, SWK 1100, and SWK 2230.
- Students must submit a separate application form to the Social Work program by February 1 during their second or sophomore year (while studying at Clark State).
- 120 hours minimum are required for a BA degree at Wright State.
