- In order to be admitted fully as a crime and justice studies major at Wright State, students will need to achieve a cumulative GPA of a 2.0.
- Students must also earn a C or higher in ENG 1111 at Clark State.
- 133 hours minimum are required for a BS degree at Wright State.

Transfer to Wright State University

Students must earn a minimum 2.0 GPA from Clark State College in order to transfer to Wright State.

Wright State processes applications as they are received. To help you make a smooth and timely transition, we recommend you submit your application by the following dates:

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
