To be admitted to the Nursing for Registered Nurses major, students must show evidence of having met the following requirements:

- Evidence of graduation in good standing from a state-approved associate degree nursing program
- Minimum 2.00 (on a 4.0 scale) overall GPA
- Active, unrestricted registered nurse (RN) license in the state in which practica will be completed
- Completion of required science courses or their direct equivalents with a cumulative 2.0 GPA
 - Anatomy and Physiology: BSCI 21010 and BSCI 21020
 - Chemistry: CHEM 10055 or CHEM 10050 or CHEM 10060
 - Microbiology: BSCI 20021

Requirements to graduate with the BS degree program: To graduate, students must have minimum 120 credits hours, 39 upper-division credits hours of coursework, a minimum 2.0 major GPA and minimum 2.00 cumulative GPA. They must also fulfill an approved experiential learning experience, a two-course diversity requirement (domestic and global), complete a writing intensive course with a minimum C (2.000) grade.
