Governor's Senior Advisor for Aerospace and Defense

He is a master navigator, a distinguished graduate of the U.S. Air Force Test Pilot School, and a certified Acquisition Program Manager who has presided over advanced technology contracts of major aircraft systems.

Joe serves as the Governor's Senior Advisor for Aerospace and Defense. In this position he identifies and seeks growth opportunities for the state's military and aerospace installations, concentrates on economic development opportunities of defense industries, and works to advance the quality of life for service members and their families.
