



Philosophy Transfer Program

Students who complete an Associate of Arts (AA) degree at Clark State Community College may transfer into the Bachelor of Arts in Philosophy at Antioch College. Students should verify their Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) requirements with the financial aid office at Clark State before pursuing classes outside of their AA degree requirements. Students at Clark State who have questions about the transferability of specific courses should contact the Registrar at Antioch College at registrar@antiochcollege.edu.

Admission Requirements to the Philosophy Program at Antioch College

- 1) Cumulative GPA ≥ 2.0
- 2) Grades of C or higher in all courses considered for transfer

Additional Information

To be able to enter the typical third-year curriculum of the Philosophy major, the following courses should be completed prior to transfer. Note that these courses have no equivalency at Clark State Community College, and thus must be completed at Antioch College or another SOCHE school via cross-registration. (All humanities-related majors at Antioch College have requirements across history, literature, and philosophy.)

a Antioch College transfers courses by equivalencies, not credits; most courses are 4 quarter credits, and labs are not separate courses.

b To satisfy part of the General Education requirements at Antioch College, transfer students are only required to take one course in each of the areas of Arts, Humanities, Sciences, and Social Sciences. However, more than this will be accepted for transfer credit, and students are strongly encouraged to satisfy the general education requirements at Clark State to receive a full Associate's Degree before attending Antioch College. While Antioch College does not require OTM-approved courses, students are encouraged to take OTM approved courses to ensure greater transferability.

While the Associate of Arts degree is 60-62 semester credit hours, students are strongly encouraged to complete all of the coursework listed above to prepare for their third year at Antioch College.

To complete the General Education requirements at Antioch College, a student transferring from Clark State Community College who has completed an Associate's Degree and the Ohio Transfer Module will need to take the following additional General Education courses:

To complete the general degree requirements at Antioch College, a student transferring from Clark State Community College must demonstrate an appropriately high level of oral proficiency in a second language. Antioch College has a proficiency-based language program; as such, language courses do not automatically transfer.

Credit by Examination in Languages may be awarded upon demonstration of language proficiency.
