## 1. DEGREES AND CERTIFICATES

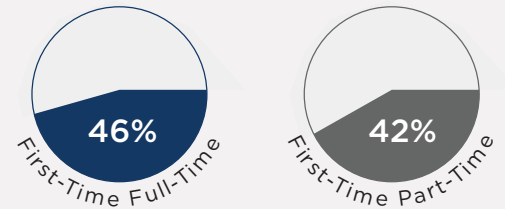
During academic year 2016-2017 students were awarded with 639 degrees and long-term certificates and 702 short-term certificates.



## 2. RETENTION RATES

Retention rates measure the percentage of first-time students who return to the institution to continue their studies the following fall.

Forty-six percent of first-time, full-time students who enrolled in Fall 2015 returned in the Fall of 2016. The retention rate for first-time, part-time students was 42%.

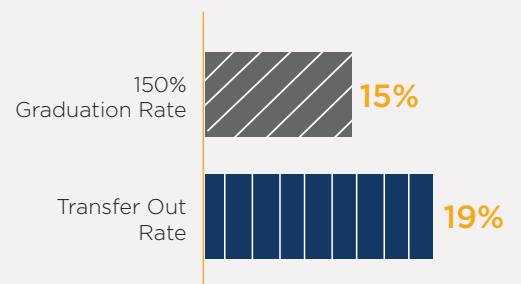


## 3. GRADUATION AND TRANSFER RATES

The overall graduation rate is also known as the “Student Right to Know” or IPEDS graduation rate. It tracks the progress of students who began their studies as full-time, first-time degree- or certificate-seeking students to see if they complete a degree or other award such as a certificate within 150% of “normal time” for completing the program in which they are enrolled.

Transfer-out rate represents percentage of the full-time, first-time students who transferred to another institution.

The 3-year graduation rate for full-time students entering in Fall 2013 was 15%. The 3-year transfer out rate was 19%.



## 2. DEFAULT RATE

An institution’s Cohort Default Rate is the percentage of the institution’s former students who entered repayment on a FFEL/Direct Loan during the relevant cohort year who defaulted before the end of the second fiscal year following the cohort year. A total of 1,988 entered loan repayment between October 1, 2016 and September 30, 2017; **368 borrowers defaulted on their loans resulting in a cohort default rate of 18.5% for that borrower group.**
