Students who complete an Associate of Applied Business degree in Accounting at Clark State Community College may transfer into Degree in Accounting at Wittenberg University. Students should verify their satisfactory academic progress (SAP) requirements with the financial aid office before pursuing classes outside of their Associate of Applied Business degree requirements.

Students interested in pursuing Accounting degree at Wittenberg University are encouraged to take the following courses in addition to the Associate of Accounting Technology degree at Clark State Community College.

Ohio Transfer Module Courses – See options below

Admission Requirements to Professional Degree Program at Wittenberg University

1. Cumulative GPA of 2.5 and have completed a minimum of 24 credit hours including ENG 1100 and 2100 (or equivalent) with a grade of C or higher, plus three other Transfer University Core courses from Element 3, 4, or 5.
2. Students can transfer up to 94 credits to Wittenberg University and all transfer credits must have a grade of C or higher.

Additional Information

- Degree seeking students at Wittenberg University must complete at least 32 semester hours of credits to earn a degree.

- This agreement will expire two years from date of signature.
