

Transfer Articulation Agreement Between Clark State College and Antioch College

This agreement articulates a transfer pathway between Clark State College (Clark State) and Antioch College (Antioch) that is streamlined and clear, values as much prior learning as possible from the Clark State curriculum and recent workplace experience, and uses the flexibility and self-designed pathways of the Antioch curriculum, all to the benefit of students.

1. Students may transfer up to 60 semester credits from Clark State, which is transcripted as up to 90 quarter credits at Antioch.

Antioch College will recognize any courses with a passing grade (C- or higher). Antioch College offers a single, self-designed major (BA or BS options), with several interdisciplinary pathways that offer students considerable flexibility to satisfy remaining degree requirements. Therefore, Antioch will recognize most transfer courses using general transfer container courses for the divisional prefix and level, preserving the original course title for the transcript. Example: GSCT 201: Anatomy and Physiology 1. Specific course equivalencies will be used for a limited number of common prerequisites in the Antioch curriculum. Students work with faculty advisors to craft an individual degree plan that incorporates all of their coursework, including transfer courses. Current interdisciplinary pathways include the following, subject to change:

Culture, Power, and Change Interdisciplinary Arts and Creative Practice Global Studies and Engagement Social Enterprise and Social Innovation Sustainability and the Environment

2. Students who have earned an AA or AS degree (non-technical) will be credited as having fulfilled all Antioch College general education requirements, except those normally taken in the final year.

Antioch College has a distinct general education program. It will recognize the accredited AA or AS (non-technical) degrees as having satisfied all general education requirements as a bundle, with the following exceptions:

- Senior Reflection Paper (ANTC 494, 2 credits). This course supports the culminating integration of prior learning, including transfer courses.
- Final co-operative field experience (COOP 390, 12 credits). This signature program supports the workplace readiness of all Antioch College graduates.



• Competency-based language requirement. This is satisfied by a score of high-novice on the third-party Oral Proficiency Interview (OPI) or a passing grade in a 200-level language course offered through Antioch College. Note: Antioch offers additional pathways specific to transfer students entering in their third year, depending on their placement. See appended policy.

3. Students have the option to earn up to 12 additional quarter credits (8 semester credits) for prior recent workplace experience.

Students may enroll in COOP 125T, a special course for transfer students, to reflect on prior workplace experience to transfer in as an additional 12-credit co-op.

4. Transfer students are eligible for the same financial aid packages as any degreeseeking student.

Antioch is committed to an affordable, high-quality liberal arts education. Transfer status is not considered when making financial aid awards, except for any funds specifically designated to support transfer students.

This agreement will expire on June 30, 2028. It may be amended or renewed at any time by mutual agreement.
