Students who complete an A.A.S. degree in "Criminal Justice" Technology at Clark State Community College may transfer into in Criminology and Criminal Justice at Wittenberg University. Students should verify their satisfactory academic progress (SAP) requirements with the financial aid office before pursuing classes outside of their A.A.S. degree requirements.

Students interested in pursuing Criminology and Criminal Justice at Wittenberg University are encouraged to take the following courses in addition to the A.A.S. degree at Clark State Community College.

Ohio Transfer Module Courses – See options below

Admission Requirements to Professional Degree Program at Wittenberg University

1. Cumulative GPA of 2.5 and have completed a minimum of 24 credit hours including ENG 1100 and 2100 (or equivalent) with a grade of C or higher, plus three other Transfer University Core courses from Element 3, 4, or 5.
2. Students can transfer up to 94 credits to Wittenberg University
3. All courses must have a grade of C or higher to be transferred to Wittenberg University

Additional Information

- Degree seeking students at Wittenberg University must complete at least 32 semester hours of credits to earn a degree.

- This agreement will expire two years from date of signature.
