- Students are required to begin their Wright State program in fall term of the junior year/year three.
- Students must apply as a non-degree seeking student to Wright State **and** submit a SOCHE Cross Registration form by January 15 of the freshman year/year one (while still studying at Clark State) in order to register for field experience, ED 2650 Field Experience I at Wright State, by January 15 of freshman year/year one.
*Note that students will complete ED 2750 Field Experience II at Wright State in the following semester after completing ED 2650.
- Students will need to either complete MTH 1280 College Algebra (or MTH 1280 College Algebra or MTH 1340 Pre-Calculus at Clark State) or place out of the course via Wright State's placement test or equivalent (e.g., ALEKS score of 61 or higher) in order to register for MTH 3430 Algebra and Functions for Middle School Teachers. Consult with Wright State academic advisor for details.
- In addition to submitting the program application, the following criteria are required for full admission into the Intervention Specialist program:
 - Cumulative minimum GPA of 2.6
 - A minimum of 60 semester hours (including in-progress courses)
 - Grade of C or higher in each of the following:
 - EDU 1110, EDU 2217, and PSY 2218 at Clark State
 - ED 2100, ED 2650, ED 2800, and MTH 2415 at Wright State
 - All Concentration Area courses
 - Passing scores in each of the following areas:
 - One of the following reading scores:

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- ACT reading score of 19 or better
- SAT evidence-based reading and writing score of 520 or better
- ETS praxis core academic skills for educators reading score of 162 or better
- One of the following writing scores:
 - ACT writing score of 6 or better
 - SAT writing dimension score of 5 or better
 - ETS praxis core academic skills for educators writing score of 165 or better
- One of the following math scores:
 - ACT math score of 17 or better
 - SAT math score of 510 or better
 - ETS praxis core academic skills for educators math score of 158 or better

1. ADMISSIONS AND DEADLINES

Join the Wright Path Program

Students interested in applying to the Wright Path must submit a request for membership at wright.edu/wrightpath/clark-state.

High School students must have completed their junior year before applying to the Wright Path, and current Clark State College students must have a minimum 2.0 GPA.

Transfer to Wright State University

Students must earn a minimum 2.0 GPA from Clark State College in order to transfer to Wright State. To be admitted into the Intervention Specialist Program at Wright State, students must earn a minimum 2.6 GPA from Clark State College.

Students are required to begin their Wright State program in fall term of the junior year/year three.

In addition to submitting the program application, the following criteria are required for full admission into the Intervention Specialist program:

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- Cumulative minimum GPA of 2.6
- A minimum of 60 semester hours (including in-progress courses)
- Grade of C or higher in each of the following:
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 - ED 2100, ED 2650, and MTH 2415 at Wright State
 - All Concentration Area courses
- Passing scores in each of the following areas:
 - One of the following reading scores:
 - ACT reading score of 19 or better
 - SAT evidence-based reading and writing score of 520 or better
 - ETS praxis core academic skills for educators reading score of 162 or better
 - One of the following writing scores:
 - ACT writing score of 6 or better
 - SAT writing dimension score of 5 or better
 - ETS praxis core academic skills for educators writing score of 165 or better
 - One of the following math scores:
 - ACT math score of 17 or better
 - SAT math score of 510 or better
 - ETS praxis core academic skills for educators math score of 158 or better
