Apply for Financial Aid

Send Your Transcripts

If you've attended regionally accredited colleges other than Clark State, request that your transcripts be sent to us. If your previous college credits allow you to bypass the placement tests (college-level English and math), an unofficial copy of your transcript may be used for the first semester only. To register for subsequent semesters and to have transfer credits evaluated, you must provide an official copy of your transcript.

Transcript evaluation can take up to six (6) weeks. Once it is complete, you will receive an e-mail notification, and you can view your transferred credits via Student Planning on the student portal. Visit **accuplacer.collegeboard.org** for test information and sample questions.

Take the Placement Tests

You must take placement tests, unless you have previous college credits in English and math or adequate ACT/SAT scores. You must bring your acceptance letter and a valid photo ID when you come in to take the tests. Remote testing is available if you are an online student and you do not live near one of the Clark State campuses. If you have a documented disability (either a physical or learning disability) and need special accommodations for taking the placement test, make prior arrangements with the Office of Accessibility.
