High School students must have completed their junior year before applying to the Wright Path, and current Clark State College students must have a minimum 2.0 GPA.

Transfer to Wright State University

Students must earn a minimum 2.0 GPA from Clark State College in order to transfer to Wright State. To be admitted into the Middle Childhood Education Program at Wright State, students must earn a minimum 2.6 GPA from Clark State College.

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Students must apply for admission to Wright State and the Middle Childhood Education program by January 15 of the sophomore year/year two (while still studying at Clark State). Additionally, students must apply for field experience, ED 2650 Field Experience I at Wright State, by January 15 of sophomore year/year two.

*Note that students must apply and be admitted to the university <u>before</u> Middle Childhood Education Program and field applications can be approved.

Students are required to begin their Wright State program in fall term of the junior year/year three.

In addition to submitting the program application, the following criteria are required for full admission into the Middle Childhood Education program:

- Cumulative minimum GPA of 2.6
- A minimum of 60 semester hours (including in-progress courses)
- Grade of C or higher in each of the following:
 - MTH 2415 at Wright State
 - Any equivalent transfer courses and Wright State courses that are applicable to the Wright State Core Requirements that are related to the students' two respective concentration areas (Language Arts, Mathematics, Science, and Social Studies)
 - All Teacher Education courses: EDU 1110, EDU 2217, and PSY 2218 at Clark State
- Passing scores in each of the following areas:
 - One of the following reading scores:
 - o ACT reading score of 19 or better
 - o SAT evidence-based reading and writing score of 520 or better
 - ETS praxis core academic skills for educators reading score of 162 or better
 - o One of the following writing scores:
 - o ACT writing score of 6 or better
 - o SAT writing dimension score of 5 or better
 - ETS praxis core academic skills for educators writing score of 165 or better
 - One of the following math scores:
 - ACT math score of 17 or better
 - SAT math score of 510 or better
 - ETS praxis core academic skills for educators math score of 158 or better
