 - *Note that students must apply and be admitted to the university <u>before</u> Middle Childhood Education Program and field applications can be approved.
- In addition to submitting the program application, the following criteria are required for full admission into the Middle Childhood Education program:
 - Cumulative minimum GPA of 2.6
 - A minimum of 60 semester hours (including in-progress courses)
 - o Grade of C or higher in each of the following:
 - All Pre-Professional Core courses
 - Any equivalent transfer courses and Wright State courses that are applicable to the Wright State Core Requirements that are related to the students' concentration areas
 - All Teacher Education courses: EDU 1110, EDU 2217, and PSY 2218 at Clark State
 - Passing scores in each of the following areas:
 - One of the following reading scores:
 - ACT reading score of 19 or better
 - SAT evidence-based reading and writing score of 520 or better
 - ETS praxis core academic skills for educators reading score of 162 or better
 - One of the following writing scores:
 - ACT writing score of 6 or better
 - SAT writing dimension score of 5 or better
 - ETS praxis core academic skills for educators writing score of 165 or better
 - One of the following math scores:
 - ACT math score of 17 or better
 - SAT math score of 510 or better
 - ETS praxis core academic skills for educators math score of 158 or better
