

**Sinclair Community College Associate of Applied Science in Addiction Services (MHTCD.S.AAS)
to Clark State College
Bachelor of Applied Science in Addiction and Integrated Treatment Studies (BASAITs)**

Students who complete an Associate of Applied Science in Addiction Services degree from Sinclair Community College and who meet the admission requirements outlined below, may transfer into the Bachelor of Applied Science in Addictions and Integrated Treatment Studies (BASAITs) program at Clark State College.

Academic Requirements

Persons seeking a career in social services should recognize that to be successful, they must be emotionally stable, creative, and flexible. A social services professional must be able to work effectively with diverse groups of people and individuals with a wide variety of ages, racial and cultural backgrounds, and life situations. ENG 1111 must be completed with a grade of C or better before enrolling in additional courses. Students will be expected to meet minimum behavioral expectancies to continue in the Social Services program. Acceptance into the program is subject to review and recommendations from the AITS Program Coordinator. The third-and fourth-year courses all require instructor permission for registration.

Math Requirements

Students should speak with their faculty advisor regarding whether MTH 1070 Quantitative Reasoning or STT 2640 Elementary Statistics I, should be taken in order to meet the program's math requirement. If they are considering transferring to a university setting to complete their master's degree, the STT 2640 Elementary Statistics I course may be preferable.

Graduation Requirements

In order to graduate, students must obtain a C or better in all SWK courses and demonstrate professional ethical behavior, effective oral and written communication, professional documentation skills, basic listening skills, and an awareness of personal biases as they affect clients. Upon graduation, a student will have also fulfilled the required semester hours of General Education as prescribed by the Ohio Transfer 36 policy.

Students are encouraged to engage in the Prior Learning Assessment process to get credit for an additional 500 field hours (SWK 2274/94) by the end of their third-year course work.

APPLICABILITY, REVIEW, AND EFFECTIVE DATE

- A. Applicability:** This agreement applies to both parties and to any and all of their respective employees, agents, and consultants involved in course design, maintenance, documentation, and delivery, as well as evaluation of course materials and students. Nothing in this agreement shall take precedence or negate in any way the policy, directives, and procedures of the respective signatory. Conflicts between this document and any other guidance shall be referred to the respective point of contact for resolution. If a satisfactory resolution cannot be achieved at this level, the responsible

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points of contact shall refer the matter to the signatories of this agreement through their respective channels.

- B. Review:** When requested by either party, the parties will convene to consider whether this agreement remains beneficial to both parties and will consider all potential modifications or updates to optimize the agreement.
- C. Effective Date:** This agreement is effective upon acceptance of both parties as indicated by the authorized signatures below. This agreement needs to be reviewed and renewed every three (3) years. This agreement will expire December 2025 unless renewed.

VOLUNTARY CHARACTER OF RELATIONSHIP

Each Party:

- A.** Acknowledges their voluntary participation in this cooperative arrangement and in doing so imposes no obligation to expend money or other resources beyond the simple administrative actions outlined in this agreement.
 - a. Agrees to bear its own cost of participation in this agreement. All costs incurred under this agreement are gratuitously rendered and will not result in a charge or obligation to the other Party.
 - b. Agrees the relationship of the Parties under this agreement and any resulting written agreements shall be that of independent contractors, and neither Party shall be deemed, nor shall hold itself out as being, a partner, broker, employee, servant, or agent of the other Party.
 - c. Agrees neither Party shall be liable for the acts, statements, or representations of the other which in any way relate to this agreement.

TERMINATION

Either Party, without cause, may terminate this agreement with written notice to the other Party within ninety days.

- A.** Upon notice of termination, both Parties will update their respective websites.
- B.** Clark State College agrees to accept validated transfer credits presented to Clark State College by a student through the close of business on the termination date.
- C.** Notwithstanding the foregoing, either Party may immediately terminate this agreement in the event that participation under the agreement gives rise to

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a violation of any requirement of federal or state law, regulation, or the requirements of any accrediting agency having jurisdiction.
